2024 Sustainable Peering Infrastructure Funding Program: we’re excited to announce that the Sustainable Peering Infrastructure Funding Program is now open for applications. Funding will specifically support: Existing IXPs that need additional funding to grow or become sustainable Organizations that hope to build a new IXP Entities that work with local communities to improve peering and infrastructure Entities that provide a positive contribution to the entire IXP ecosystem.

Grant funds are available to assist in equipment purchases (switches, optic modules, servers, and routers), training, capacity building, and community development.

Applications are accepted in two windows: 16 January-22 March 2024, and again from 1 July-6 September 2024.
